JUBILEE OF MERCY**

Preparations are being made for the celebration of the Jubilee Year of Mercy, which His Holiness Pope Francis has proclaimed. This celebration will begin with the opening of the Holy Door at St. Peter’s Basilica in Rome on December 8, 2015.

In dioceses throughout the world, Holy Doors will open on December 13, 2015, the Third Sunday of Advent.

St. Joseph Co-Cathedral in Burlington has been chosen as the site of the Holy Door. There were several reasons for this choice: its status as a co-cathedral, its architectural suitability for the construction of a Holy Door, and its capacity to receive large groups of pilgrims.

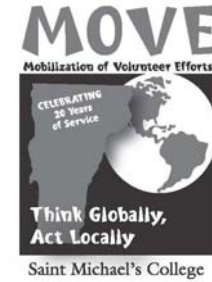


VITA is a group of students who are committed to ministering to other students through practicing our faith and leading many of the liturgical, retreat, and service programs. Student-led programs include:
