

Message from Fr. Brian Cummings, S.S.E.

Dear Sisters and Brothers,

Each November, beginning with the solemnity of All Saints and the Feast of All Souls, the Church remembers in a special way all the faithful who have died. It is part of our tradition that we pray for those who have gone before us. We also pray to our deceased loved ones that they may intercede to God on our behalf.

In our Masses during the month of November, the Edmundite Community will remember all the deceased members and loved ones of the Saint Michael's College Community. At each liturgy there will be a special petition in the Prayer of the Faithful asking God to grant eternal life to our loved ones who have died. We pray with hope that they will share in Christ's resurrection, believing that in death life is not ended, but changed. You are invited to write the names of your deceased loved ones and friends in our Book of Life located in the Chapel lobby.

November is also a time for us as a nation to give thanks to God for His abundant blessings upon us and our country. As we give thanks to God, we are reminded of the social ills plaguing our society. It seems that every time we look at the news we see nothing but wars and death, starvation and poverty, and the loss of innocent life. We know too well that our own community is not immune to such tragedy and despair. Sometimes the reported news can be depressing and paralyzing. I sometimes feel a sense of powerlessness over it all and wonder if our society will ever improve and reflect the Kingdom of God as revealed in the teachings of Jesus.

One way we can make a small difference is helping those in our midst who struggle each day to put food on the family table in this difficult economy. Edmundite Campus Ministry has been assisting the Chittenden Emergency Food Shelf for the past several years each holiday season to help provide basic nutrition and nourishment for struggling families. We are asking members of our Worshipping Community to provide financial assistance directly to the Food Shelf to help alleviate hunger in our community.

Envelopes will be available at each entrance of the Chapel beginning November 10th. Donations may be mailed directly to their headquarters (228 North Winooski Avenue, Burlington, VT 05401). I ask you to please be generous as times continue to be difficult in our surrounding communities. Let us resist the sense of powerlessness and believe that we can make a difference in people's lives by helping those who need food. Vermont Collegiate Choral Consortium presents a Mozart Masterwork: Three VT college choruses are combining forces to sing one of the greatest major choral works in the repertory, Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's vibrant *Solenn Vespers*, composed in 1780. Teaming up are the Castleton State College Chamber Singers; the Johnson State College Chamber Singers; and the St. Michael's College Chorale. The *Vesperae*

Solennes de Confessore is a setting of six texts from the Book of Psalms and the New Testament. Mozart composed the work at the age of 24 for the cathedral choir in his hometown of Salzburg. The Mozart performances will mark the third collaboration among Vermont collegiate choral programs, following exciting performances of Leonard Bernstein's *Chichester Psalms* in 2010 and Gabriel Fauré's *Requiem* in 2012. The 70 singers of the combined ensembles will perform on **Saturday, November 23rd, 7:00 p.m.** at the Chapel of Saint Michael the Archangel. Admission is free, but donations will be appreciated. 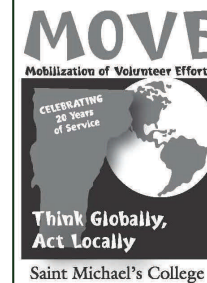


VITA is a group of students who are committed to ministering to other students through practicing our faith and leading many of the liturgical, retreat, and service programs. Student-led programs include:
