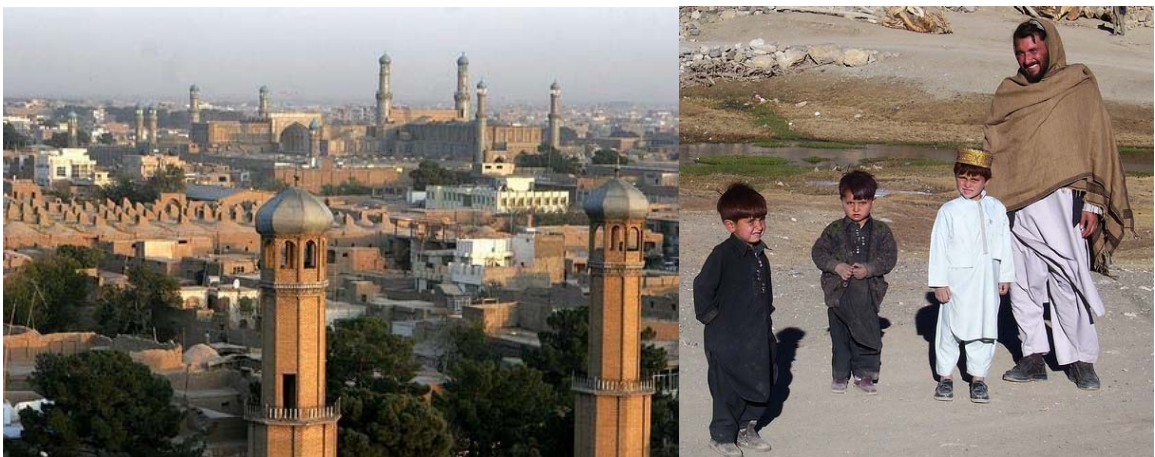

در سال ۱۹۹۸ از افغانستان ترک کردم و به ایالات متحد امریکا آمدم. خوشحالتترین روز حیات من بود ولی هنوز زیاد مشکلات داشتم. فقط بسیار کم زبان انگلیسی گپ زدم. تصمیم گرفته بودم تا "انگلیسی به حیث زبان دوم" شامل شوم. بعد از رسیدنم در امریکا در شهر نیو یورک زندگی میگردم ولی وقتیکه فامیل من هم در امریکا رسیدند ما به آیالات نیو همیشیر کوچ کردیم. در آنجا ادامه کردم تا زبان انگلیسی را درس بخوانم و آن را تمرین کنم. بچیم به لیسه میرفت و او کمک کرد تا انگلیسی را به مه تدریج کند. من کار در ریاست دولتی یافتم. خانم تصمیم گرفت که بخواهد تحصیلاتش را ادامه کند. او به فاکولته حقوق رفت. در سال ۲۰۰۴ هر دو ما اتباع امریکایی شدیم. و کمی وقت بعد او از پوهنتون فارغ شد. من بعضی کورس ها در پوهنتون اهالی درس خواندم ولی هنوز هیچ سرتفیکیت به ست نا آورده ام. هنوز در همان ریاست کار میکنم ولی زبان انگلیسی بسیار خوبتر کپ میزنم. و خانم و پسر من خواب امریکایی را زندگی میکنند و برای آن بسیار خوشحال استم.

My name is Mohammad Farhad Rahman. I was born in the year of 1961 in the city of mazara-shareef. My father had a business that produced many types of clothing and he was successful. My family lived a very comfortable life. When I was still very young my mother became ill and after a few months of her suffering she died. I also had 2 brothers and 5 sisters. After high school I moved to Kabul in order to continue education at Kabul university. It happened during this time that the Soviets came to Afghanistan.

The era of Soviets was very sad and tragic. My father loved freedom and was a patriot until the day of his death. He always criticized the Soviet Union. This was a great problem because they knew of the great respect the people had for my father and this made him very dangerous. Then one night a group of soldiers came by the house of my father and took him and both of my brothers and shot them and killed them. I received news of this 2 weeks later and I immediately returned to mazara-shareef. I sold the house and brought my 2 younger sisters back to Kabul with me. There they went to school and I returned to university.

Finally in 1986 I graduated with a degree in politics. By this time my sisters were out of school and have started their own families. I married with a very beautiful woman who is the daughter of a very important mujahad. We had 2 children who were twins but during childbirth one of them died. Finally it seemed that my life was beginning. For several years I worked for my father's former business. But in 1996 the Taliban came to Afghanistan. This was a time of great pain and destruction. My wife's father took my wife and son to Pakistan in order to escape from the Taliban. But because I was educated they were looking for me.

In 1998 I fled from Afghanistan and came to the United States of America. That was the happiest day in my life but still I had many problems. I only spoke very little English language. I had decided to enroll in an "English as a second language course". After my arrival in America I was living in New York City, but when my family came to join me, we moved to New Hampshire state. There I continued to study the English language and practice it. My son was going to high school and he helped to teach me English. Soon after I found a job working at a government office. My wife also decided that she wanted to continue her education and she went to law school. In the year of 2004 both of us became American citizens. A short while after my wife graduated from the law school. I studied some courses at the local university but I have still not earned a college certificate. I still work for that same government office but my English language skills have become much better. My wife and my son are now living America's dream and for this reason I am very happy.
